Mazie was a faithful and constant companion. For nearly 17 years, she waited and anticipated her "mom's" arrival. Susan couldn't play hide and seek without everyone cheating and asking her "Where's mom?" and her nose would find her quickly.

That mom had quite a few surgeries and whether it was typical illness or recovering for weeks after a procedure, Mazie stayed literally by her side...she preferred the left side when in a recliner or couch and sleeping in the nice king bed with "dad" she preferred the right side...as in RIGHT in between them both.

Mazie began to have issues with her eyesight and it was confirmed that she had cataracts along with hearing loss. Both of those got worse and a few months ago, Mazie went almost completely blind. Things got very hard for her and she stayed afraid and mostly lost in her own home.

Her sisters helped care for her when the "parents" would be traveling and Mazie would become a camping dog, thought I'm not sure she really ever cared for it, she was with mom and that made it alright. 15th Street clinic and her oldest sister, Amy, did nothing less than the best for her.

Grand kids made the world a lot different for Mazie, and though she was never huge on having little kids around, she dealt with it and if one of them happened to throw a ball, she didn't have the will to refuse to fetch it.

It was after a short few days in Texas, that Mazie decided she could wait for mom to get home from work that Monday afternoon and it was in her own back yard that Mazie finally yielded to what no one ever wanted, she left us.

I will forever grieve this girl. She saved me. Literally. I had asked her to get me through my dad's cancer and fate...she did. He has been gone just 2 months and if I imagine it just right, I can picture him
