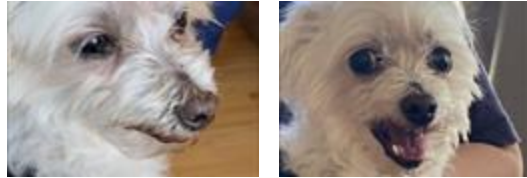

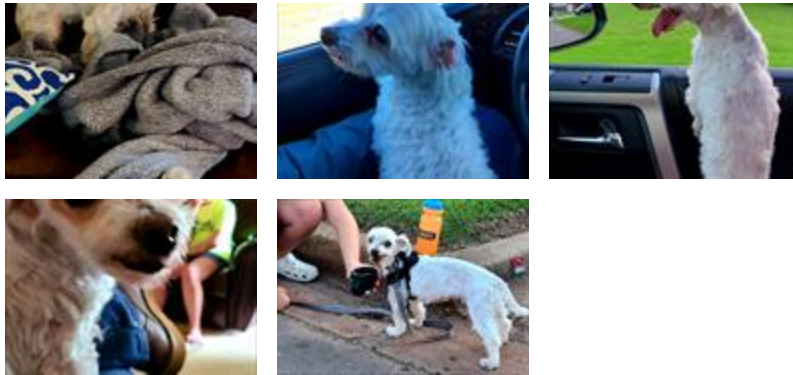
I feel sad because he died. It made me feel better to do art and draw pictures about him.

Once rescued, Milo had a great life and lots of human friends. Thanks for the memories, Milo: you will be missed.

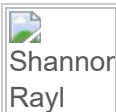
